

Spread the Word!

Greetings Sharon Church Friends,

Now that Easter has come and gone it's important that we let the amazing news of the Gospel of Jesus Christ marinate in us deeply. Unless we were distracted, or simply not paying attention, we just heard again about the amazing fact that God loved us enough to send His Son Jesus to offer spiritual healing, restored rela-

tionship with our creator, and eternal life through the Cross and the Empty Tomb. This news couldn't be any better. In Jesus we are born again of water and the Holy Spirit and set free in the world to love, serve, heal, worship, and invite other people to join us. The Apostle Paul said it this way in his letter to the First Century Church in Ephesus: ". . . even when we were dead through our trespasses, God made us alive together with Christ." We are a faith family and God wants our family to increase with new believers in the weeks and months to come. We have been saved for a reason; to introduce people to Jesus Christ and to help that relationship to grow.

In the weeks ahead I will be offering a Sunday Morning message series titled "Spread the Word." My prayer as that by demystifying evangelism and offering a biblical vision for sharing the Gospel we will experience true revival at Sharon Methodist Church as we spread the word about our faith in Jesus to the hungry souls all around us. I look forward to what God will do in and through us as we open our hearts and minds to our mission of making disciples.

Lori Minor and I had the honor and pleasure of supporting two of our Community Partners last week by attending their special community celebrations of Grand Openings and Ribbon Cuttings.

On Thursday, March 21, Lori and I attended the Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting celebration held at the new office/warehouse facility of Brunswick Family Assistance in Bolivia. We met some of their other community partners, as well as staff members. We learned about some special programs offered by BFA such as Summer Food Program, Birthday Wishes, Christmas in July, Fill the Sleigh and Christmas Program. We were able to see where they store the food that is available in their Mobile Food Pantry, and we discovered that their Mobile Food Pantry also offers pet food, supplied by PawsAbility. It was such an eye-opening experience to learn about all that is offered by BFA. Sharon Methodist Church partners with Brunswick Family Assistance by donations from our Missions and Outreach Team, as well as offering them an office space for their community satellite program. You will see BFA on our campus the 2nd Thursday of each month, with their Mobile Food Pantry outside in the parking lot, as well as their representative in the office located in The Crossing. Anyone in the community may apply for assistance, or any of their programs, during this time. Now that their headquarters has moved to Bolivia, it is very important for them to offer these satellite locations so they can reach folks without transportation. On Saturday, March 23, Lori and I, accompanied by our husbands, Mark and Bill, attended the Grand Opening and Ribbon Cutting celebration held at the new men's facility for Christian Recovery Centers, Inc. in Shallotte. Christian Recovery Centers, Inc. is a faith-based, 4-6 month residential, non-profit recovery center for men and women. The new facility in Shallotte will house 102 men seeking recovery from substance abuse. We were amazed by the beauty and functionality of this new facility, also to find out that they are already serving 88 male residents. The grand opening was filled with testimonies of faith, and living proof that the love of God can transform people from substance abusers into upstanding members of the community. Christian Recovery Centers, Inc. also operates the Rose House for women. Their residential program offers graduates continuing education at Brunswick Community College, as well as job placement programs. They offer residents an opportunity to work in their small businesses such as Landscaping and Pressure Washing, as well as the CRCI Thrift Store. The Executive Director of CRCI, Josh Torbich, is a graduate of the program, and one of the many miraculous stories to be heard if you visit one of their facilities. Sharon Methodist Church partners with CRCI by donations from our Missions and Outreach Team.

I am grateful for the blessings that can be found between Sharon Methodist Church and our Community Partners, and I look forward to discovering more about each of these partners!




With Holy Week, which culminated with the glory of celebrating our risen Lord, behind us, it might be a time to look a little bit into the lives and times of the disciples that followed Jesus. A few days ago, I found the following article on Facebook and although a bit long, I would like to share it with all of you.

HOW THE APOSTLES DIED

- 1. Matthew suffered martyrdom in Ethiopia, killed by a sword wound.
- 2.Mark in Alexandria, Egypt, after being dragged by horses through the streets until he was dead.
- 3. Luke hanged in Greece as a result of tremendous preaching to the lost.
- 4. John faced martyrdom



- 5. Peter He was crucified upside down on an X shaped cross. According to church tradition it was because he told his tormentors that he felt unworthy to die in the same way Jesus had died.
- 6. James The leader of the church in Jerusalem, was thrown over a hundred feet down from the southeast pinnacle of the Temple when he refused to deny his faith in Christ. When they discovered that he survived the fall, his enemies beat James to death with a fuller's club.
- 7. James, the son of Zebedee a strong leader of the church, he was beheaded in Jerusalem.

- 8. Bartholomew also known as Nathaniel was hung 9. Andrew was crucified on an X shaped cross in Patras, Greece, after being whipped severely by seven soldiers and they tied his body to the cross with cords to prolong his agony.
- 10. Thomas was stabbed with a spear in India during one of his missionary trips to establish the church in the subcontinent.
- 11. Jude was killed with arrows when he refused to deny his faith in Christ.
- 12. Matthias- the Apostle chosen to replace the traitor Judas Iscariot. He was stoned and beheaded.
- 13. Paul was tortured and then beheaded by the evil Emperor Nero of Rome in A.D. 67. He endured a lengthy imprisonment, which allowed him to write his many epistles to the churches he had formed throughout the Roman Empire.

Perhaps this is a reminder to us that our sufferings here are indeed minor compared to the intense persecution and cold cruelty faced by the Apostles and Disciples during their times for the sake of the faith. Yes, they were all persecuted because of their faith. We sometimes look past what happened then as long ago history and say, "Well, that was then and this is today". Time may have passed, but persecution has not. Each week we pray for a persecuted Christian church somewhere in the world. Lifeway Research revealed that in 2021 more Christians around the world were detained or killed when their churches were attacked than in 2020\1\. That translates to about 1 in 7 Christians were persecuted just for their faith in our God. Aren't you glad you are free to worship in this country? God is good all the time, praise him every chance you get.



Fifteen Methodist Men met on March 7th and enjoyed a fine ham meal with all the trimmings provided by Team 3 (Sam Lewis, Scott Anderson, Kevin Harland, and Larry Sellers). Martin Hommer delivered a Max Lucado devotional that reminded us that when we experience difficulties in life, God will show up and provide a way.

First, on the agenda, Jonas Daugherty reported on the need for an electronic switching component for the computer system in the Sanctuary to maximize the visual media potential of the new system. This device will allow several media sources to hook easily into the overall system without endangering our computer by using people's thumb drives which might contain viruses. The overall quality will benefit greatly, also. A vote was taken and SMM voted that we provide the funding for the switch for Sharon media programs. Next, Kevin Harland reported that several members of the Sharon Methodist Women would like to revamp the raised beds that the scouts put in a few years back. The new beds with a self-contained watering system could supply some fresh vegetable for the Neighbor to Neighbor Food Pantry. The men agreed to help with the heavy lifting of this proposal. Jonas Daugherty gave an update on establishing an underground electrical cable to the digsign. This option has been chosen to eliminate any overhead wires and poles in the vicinity of the sign. The Facilities Team has agreed that underground is the way to go for a esthetics and maintenance benefits. He also stated that a church workday will be scheduled for later this Spring, so stay tuned for the date and what needs doing.

15 large tents in storage have been used in the past for large gatherings and are not being used regularly and may dry rot in the containers. A proposal was made to keep the best 7 or 8 complete sets for church events and The Rose can sell the remaining while they are in good condition. The proposal carried.

The business meeting ended with an update on the personalized Brick program (between the Sanctuary and The Crossing). More have been ordered and we need someone in the church to step up and spearhead the program, which includes the ordering and record-keeping for the program. The SMM will do the placement of the bricks in the walkway.

Pastor Jim reminded us all to keep several members of our congregation in prayer and make contact when we can.

The Men's Prayer Breakfast on March 14th had 21 in attendance enjoying a full breakfast and fellowship. We had a good discussion when we noted God working in our lives.

Exciting things are happening at The Rose!

We continue to be blessed with generous donations for our sales floor and with the continued support of our regular customers as well as new faces every day. Word is spreading about what a treasure our store is. Thanks to all of this, we have been able to fund our Missions and Outreach ministry, contribute to Sharon Church's General Fund, the Rose Capital Reserves and give greatly needed items directly to those in need who walk through our doors.

In 2023 alone, the store has achieved the following:

Net Sales: \$162,000

Profit after expenses: \$94,500

Monetary support to our community thru missions: \$71,900

Sharon Church General Fund: \$18,000

Rose Capital Reserves: \$4,700

Clothing and household goods directly to those in need: \$2,300



If you have been to The Rose, you know we have a lot of 'temporary' sales space in use. Two Conex trailers, a tent, metal shed, and a portion of the donation sorting area. To rectify this situation, we are planning a long-needed expansion of The Rose. We are still in the very early stages of planning, but this is a rendering of one possibility (view from rear of building). We plan on adding an additional 1,500 to 2,400 square feet to the current 1,600 square feet building. To help fund this project, we will be mailing letters to local

businesses and organizations soliciting donations. We will also be restarting the 'Tree of Life' fundraiser, for those who would like to donate in their name or in memory of someone else. More information about this opportunity will be published soon.

Once again, The Rose Family would like to thank everyone for their ongoing support to this vital mission of Sharon Church. Every day we thank God for the blessings we receive and that The Rose is able to share.





Memorial Walkway – Brick Program



The memorial brick program was initiated in 2007, providing a way for families and friends to honor the lives of members of Sharon and secondly, as a way for everyone to assist in the mortgage debt reduction of the church. Sharon's memorial walkway, from the sanctuary to the education building, was started shortly after the building completion. Ms. Genita Cohen of the original fundraising committee started and maintained the program through 2015. In 2023 we updated the program, renewed supplier relations with the Brick supplier, and established an overall procedure for the program.

Since our last placement in 2019 the program has been in the background or very low key (lack of a coordinator). There have been a few requests but we haven't reached a minimum quantity for the next order. Anyone that has an outstanding request or wanting to place a new request we ask you to contact the church office.

Brick requests will be taken at any time thru the Church Secretary. The procedure:

Visit or call the church office with your request.

 $\label{eq:filling} \mbox{Fill in the form or provide the exact wording to be printed.}$

3 lines of print, 20 characters including spaces per line.

Pay the brick donation price at the time of your entry.

Brick orders will be placed on a semiannual basis or sooner if a standard order quantity is reached. Once received Sharon trustees will arrange for the installation of bricks into the Memorial Walkway.

Brick Description and Pricing:

Memorial bricks are all $4" \times 8" \times 2\%"$ kiln fired clay brick in Regimental Red color. Engraving is Laser etched and permanent.

Price of the Memorial brick is \$100 each. As the manufacturing costs varies this price has not changed since the program inception. Funds raised thru this program go directly to the Sharon Church building fund.

As mentioned above, we do need someone to step forward and coordinate or administer the program. This would include collecting and organizing forms, placing an order when appropriate and following up with the supplier, finally notifying the facilities team when they are ready to be installed. Contact the church office if this is an area of ministry you could support. - Martin Hommer


